GENUSSWELTEN presents culinary delights from first-hand suppliers for connoisseurs and gourmets.


The exhibition is dedicated to a wide variety of specialties related to the enjoyment and experience of culinary delights.

GENUSSWELTEN invites visitors with high standards and refined eating habits to particularly high-quality and exquisite enjoyment.




DISTILLATES







EXHIBITION VENUE

EXHIBITION HALL ON THE GROUND FLOOR

The exhibition hall on the ground floor of the MAK is an impressive space that is regularly used for events and exhibitions. The space itself is large and airy, with high ceilings and large windows that let in plenty of natural light. The hall offers a flexible and adaptable interior design. The exhibition space is large enough to showcase a wide range of products and also offers visitors an architecturally unique experience.



The exhibition hall on the ground floor consists of a spacious central hall with an impressive glass skylight and an outer gallery. Built in 1908, it still impresses today with its simple and elegant architecture.

ACCESSIBILITY

The MAK - Museum of Applied Arts is located in the center of Vienna, close to the historic sights of the city center. The location is easily accessible by public transportation.





MAK – MUSEUM OF APPLIED ARTS

The Museum of Applied Arts in Vienna, also known as the MAK, is a museum dedicated to the promotion of design, crafts, architecture and applied arts. It is located in the first district of Vienna near the Stadtpark and has been an important institution for Austrian art since its foundation in 1863.

The MAK Vienna collection comprises more than 200,000 objects from different eras, including furniture, glass, ceramics, jewellery and textiles. It reflects Austrian art history and design and offers a comprehensive insight into the development of applied art from antiquity to the present day.

In addition to the exhibitions, the MAK has a library and an archive that can be used for research purposes. The library contains more than 200,000 volumes and specialises in art, design and architecture. The Museum of Applied Arts in Vienna is not only an important venue for the Austrian art scene, but also for the international art world.




HISTORIC CITY OF VIENNA
